

Watershed Goals

Watershed goals were set by the Steering Committee using each of the impaired or threatened uses in the watershed. Goals have been developed for designated and desired watershed uses. The table below outlines impairments, threats, and associated watershed goals. The goals are broad and flexible results desired for restoration and protection of water resources in the Cedar Lake watershed, for both now and into the future.

Impaired/Threatened Uses	Watershed Goals
Designated Uses	
Warmwater Fishery	Restore warmwater fishery to support healthy populations of native fish species
Indigenous Aquatic Wildlife	Maintain balanced and healthy aquatic plant and wildlife community
Partial Body Contact Recreation	Maintain open and clear waterways for recreation
Full Body Contact Recreation	Preserve good water quality and reduce and/or minimize muck sediments for full body contact recreation
Desired Uses	
Groundwater Protection	Protect groundwater levels for lake recharge to achieve balanced lake levels
Maintain Lake Level	Maintain the legal lake level by protecting recharge sources and surface water inputs
Habitat Protection	Conserve and restore wetland and aquatic habitat for ecosystem function and services
